Peace and Security in the Great Lakes Region

Phase II of the EU's regional Action on Peace and Security in the GL (2023-2027):

Consists of two **Specific Objectives (SO)**:

- 1. Enhancing the effectiveness of ICGLR action to prevent and resolve conflicts in the Great Lakes Region (EJVM, EW, mediation-focused crisis management)
- 2. Improving the control of the mineral sectors in ICGLR Member States.

On behalf of the EU in support of the ICGLR, **IMPACT**:

Coordinates the overall Action (SO 1 and 2) AND Implements SO 2

Specific Objective 2 (Mineral Governance):

- Co-designed to support activities foreseen in ICGLR's 2022-26 Strategic Plan
- Budget: 7.1 million € (\$7.5 million USD)
- 48 months (Nov. 15 2023 to Nov. 14 2027)









SO2 Mineral Governance: Overall Objective

To contribute to the consolidation of peace, security, and mineral resource governance in the GLR.

This will be achieved by enhancing the capacity of the ICGLR and its Member States (MS) to:

- 1) control artisanal mineral resources, including environmental and social impacts with a particular attention to women and youth;
- apply strategies and best practice models related to artisanal gold exports;
- 3) adopt improved Regional Certification Mechanism (RCM) systems and procedures.

The Intervention Logic underpinning the project presumes that the control of the mineral sectors in ICGLR Member States (MS) can be improved by updating and strengthening the Regional Initiative on Natural Resources (RINR), by focusing on gold export regimes and by digitizing Regional Certification Mechanism (RCM) systems and procedures in line with evolving international due diligence standards
